Biography

Niki Chondrogianni graduated from the Department of Biology of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. She obtained her PhD in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology from NKUA. She was a short-term visitor at the Universities Paris 7 in France and Bristol in UK. She conducted her post-doctoral studies at the National Hellenic Research Foundation in Athens. During her post-doc, she was trained in the use of C. elegans at the Foundation of Research and Technology-Hellas, Institute of Molecular Biology and Biotechnology in Greece. She became Associate Researcher at NHRF in 2009, Senior Researcher in 2013 and Research Director in 2022. She is a national and international patent holder that resulted in the development of novel anti-ageing products that act through the activation of the proteasome system (two relative product series in the national/international market). She focuses on the genetic and environmental factors that govern ageing, longevity and age-related diseases with emphasis on proteasome regulation. She is seeking for compounds that may act as proteasome activators and thus may serve as anti-ageing agents. She is equally interested in identifying compounds that can decelerate protein aggregation and thus the progression of proteinopathies with emphasis on Alzheimer's disease using C. elegans as a model in combination with human cells of neuronal origin. She is Associate Editor in Free Radical Biology & Medicine, Elsevier and she is elected Meeting Officer of the Society for Free Radical Research-Europe, responsible for the summer schools of the society dedicated to PhD students and early post-docs.
