Biography

Spiros Efthimiopoulos received B.Sc. in Biology from the Department of Biology of the University of Patras and his Ph.D. from the same Department. Then, for a period of 10 years, he moved to the Department of Psychiatry at Mount Sinai School of Medicine where he worked as a researcher in the molecular basis of Alzheimer's disease. In 2001, joined the Teaching and Research Staff of the Department of Biology, of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens as an Assistant Professor and currently holds the position of Professor. In the period 2001 to date Professor Efthimiopoulos has substantially contributed to the education of students of the Department of Biology and other departments or schools at both undergraduate and postgraduate level; continued his research on the molecular basis of Alzheimer's disease and has produced a total of more than 50 publications. His research has been funded by both National and International organizations. Professor Efthimiopoulos has been invited to international conferences, Universities and Research centers to give lectures on his research. He has been a member of the Board, Secretary and President of the Greek Society for Neuroscience and has a significant contribution to the efforts of the Society's to raise public awareness in Neuroscience. Moreover, he has been a member of the Board, Vice President of the Panhellenic Society of Biological Sciences.
